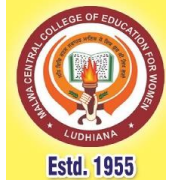

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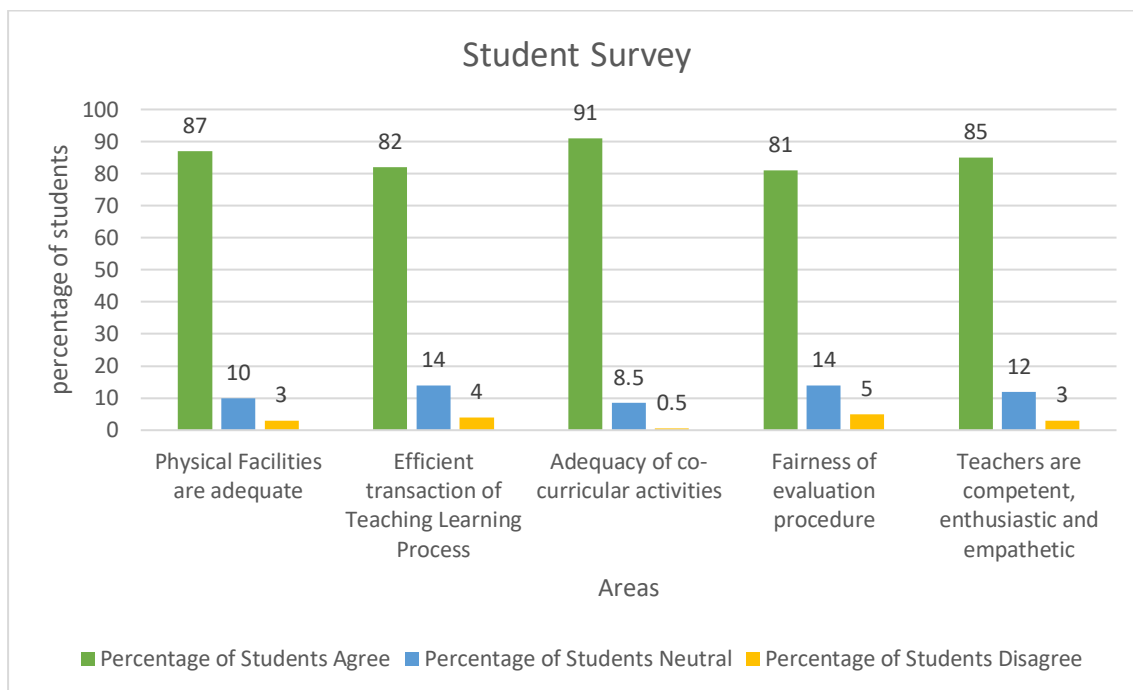
## 2.7 – Student Satisfaction Survey

2.7.1 – Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) on overall institutional performance (Institution may design the questionnaire) (results and details be provided as weblink)

At the end of every academic year, feedback is collected about curriculum content, its relevance, teaching learning process and campus experiences from students. These opinions are recorder systematically and analyzed.

In the Student Satisfaction Survey (session 2016-18), 87% of the students found the physical facilities to be adequate; 82% of the students agreed that the transaction of teaching-learning was efficient; whereas 4% of students disagreed. 91% of students were satisfied with the opportunities provided for participation in co-curricular activities; only 0.5% of students showed their dissatisfaction with the same. 81% of students confirmed that the evaluation of the course was fair, appropriate and unbiased; only 5% of students found the internal evaluation mechanism inadequate. As far as the competencies of teachers are concerned, 85% of students found the teachers to be effective, impartial, good motivators and empathetic; only 3% of students were not in agreement with the effectiveness of the teachers.
