


2.7 – Student Satisfaction Survey

At the end of every academic year, feedback is collected about curriculum content, its relevance, the teaching-learning process and campus experiences from students. These opinions are recorded systematically and analyzed.

In the Student Satisfaction Survey (session 2017-19), 90% of the students found the physical facilities to be adequate; only 2% of students found physical facilities to be inadequate. Around 91% of the students agreed that the transaction of teaching-learning was efficient; whereas 1% of students disagreed. 95% of students were satisfied with the opportunities provided for participation in co-curricular activities whereas no student showed dissatisfaction for the same. 87% of students confirmed that the evaluation of the course was fair, appropriate and unbiased; only 4% of students found the internal evaluation mechanism inadequate. As far as the competencies of teachers are concerned, 94% of students found the teachers to be effective, impartial, good motivators and empathetic; only 0.5% of students were not in agreement with the effectiveness of the teachers.
